



Michael Oliver, an employee of Nissan North America's parts distribution center in Somerset, NJ, filed a petition with the National Labor Relations Board asking for a vote to remove the UAW from his plant.



After just four years under the UAW, workers were fed up with the union.



In April 2024, 70 percent of workers voted to kick the UAW out of their plant.





"UAW union officials haven't bargained effectively or communicated well with me and my coworkers, and they have refused to inform us of bargaining developments...my coworkers and I are left with no choice but to throw out the UAW".
