## The UAW Threatens Workers



UAW officials at the Philadelphia-area Dometic plant have been accused of sending a mass text to employees "illegally threatening their employment if they choose to work during the strike."



Seven plant employees filed a charge against the union with the National Labor Relations Board in April 2024.



The threatening text reportedly sent by union official Mike Proust said: "There are and will be consequences for crossing the line becoming a scab [sic] you will be put on trial you will be judged by your peers...[you will] have no right to hold or acquire any [union-controlled] job within the plant."



Past charges against the UAW document other cases of intimidation, including a union steward who told workers that any employee who crossed the UAW's picket line during the strike would be subject to internal union charges, fined, and ultimately terminated.
